Frederick County Public Schools (MD) is a successful school system in a diverse and growing community. Frederick County bridges rural, suburban, and urban lifestyles near both the Washington, DC and Baltimore metropolitan communities. Enrollment as of September 30, 2022, was almost 47,000 students. The racial/ethnic composition of our student body is 50.4% White; 20.6% Hispanic/ Latino; 14.4% Black/African American; 7.4% Asian; 6.9% two or more races; and less than 1% American Indian/Alaskan Native and Pacific Islander/Native Hawaiian. We serve students with varying needs, including 5,200 students receiving special education services (11.1%), about 3,400 English Learners (7.3%), and over 15,000 receiving free or reduced-price meal services (32.9%).

Brunswick High School's Mission Statement: A climate of high expectations exists in our school. We provide a quality education, which features a variety of programs for all students, enabling them to achieve success regardless of gender, race, or socioeconomic status.
