CSHS members take their computer science education further and become ambassadors of STEM/STEAM education within the school and community. CSHS is open to students who have been at Brunswick High School for at least one semester. Students should have completed at least one computer science class at BHS or CTC and earned a 3.0 (B) or higher. Lastly, students should have (and maintain) a 3.25 weighted overall grade point average and be recommended by three teachers.

• The Brunswick High School National English Honor Society (NEHS) is open to juniors and seniors who maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 and an English GPA of 3.5 or higher (an application must be completed). honor." Immediate benefits of affiliation include academic recognition, scholarship and award eligibility, and opportunities for networking with others who share enthusiasm for, and accomplishment in, the language arts. The organization also strives to aid students in working toward the attainment of the highest standards in art areas and to bring art education to the attention of the school and community. Members are eligible for scholarships and special recognition and awards. Students may be sophomores, juniors, or seniors who have completed at least one semester of art during their high school years. A grade point average of 3.0 must be maintained in all art classes. Students must be recommended by at least three teachers, including one art.
