
Your transcript is the document used to verify that you successfully completed high school.

Connections - An Important Part of the Day!

Connections is a program designed to be highly responsive to the learning needs of all students.

Connections is a specified block of time that provides an opportunity for Railroaders to engage in the following activities:

- **♦** AP/SAT Enrichment
- Clubs
- Group/Enrichment Projects
- **❖** Testing Assistance
- ♦ Make up missed work
- ❖ School Counseling or Career Center
- **❖** Self-Directed Learning
- **❖** Use of Media Center

Academic Expectations and Support



Basic Academic Expectations

- Complete and turn in all assignments, prepare for every assessment
- **❖ Be aware of deadlines and meet them** "zeroes" are grade killers.
- Complete and submit your own work "academic dishonesty" includes plagiarism, copying, cheating, handing in others work as your own
- **Keep up with class pacing** full courses are taught in half a year, and the material moves quickly
- **Do you very best on state assessments** passing is a graduation requirement
- Make up missed work due to absences for excused absences, you have the same number of days you were out to make up assignments; for unexcused absences, communicate with the teacher as they may not allow you to make up work.

Basic Academic Supports

- Classroom teachers are your best resource ask to be called during Connections
- Tutoring will be available during Connections and afterschool on specific days TBD

Attendance & Eligibility



Attendance

- Good attendance □ Academic success
- Class Cut = Unexcused Absence (unlikely to be given credit for make-up work)
- Excessive unlawful absences result in class failure *regardless* of course grade
- Parents/guardians: Please send in absence notes to Main Office!

The LATE bell rings at 7:30am - Students in the hall or arriving to school after 7:30 will be directed to the MAIN OFFICE for a late pass. If they are unexcused they will serve a lunch detention THAT SAME DAY.

Eligibility

- Determined based on Terms 1 & 3 and Semesters 1 (end of term 2) & 2 (end of term 4) grades
- At least a 2.0 GPA and no Fs to be eligible
- First-time Freshmen all begin the year eligible

Dress for Success

- Students are restricted from wearing clothing that is unprofessional. (ie: cut low at neck or under the arms, exposes bare midriff, excessive amount of exposed skin)
- Undergarments, in part or in total, may not be visible.
- FCPS does not permit hats and other head coverings.
- Clothing with advertisements for, or promoting the use of, weapons, violence, alcohol, tobacco or other drugs is prohibited.
- Clothing containing sexually suggestive, racially divisive, or otherwise offensive graphics or slogans is not permitted.
- Any article of clothing that causes a school disruption or is offensive will need to be removed.

Cell Phones and Electronic Devices



Students are permitted to use cell phones and electronic devices before or after school, between classes, and during lunch.

- All cell phones electronic devices are to be silenced and put away when entering the classroom. Remove ear buds/headphones.
 Teachers must be able to communicate with students.
- Teachers may have other expectations where cell phones are concerned. Students are expected to follow all classroom practices

BHS Digital Citizenship

- In the classroom, electronic devices (including chromebooks) are permitted for educational purposes only at the discretion of the teacher.
- Students may not film other students or adults without their permission.
- Students are strongly encouraged from using social media in ways that might be considered inappropriate, cyberbullying or threatening
- ❖ Parents are encouraged to be aware of their child's digital application and social media use, and their child's digital footprint.

School - Parent/Guardian Communication is Critical



- Monitor school assignment (directions, deadlines, resources), class grades, and notes from the teacher in Schoology. Be proactive!
- Questions or concerns? Start at the level closest to the answer. You should have a response within 24 business hours.
- Parent-teacher conferences no specific day, but always a possibility, in person and virtually.

To Summarize... How Can We Work Together for Your Student's Success?




- Proactively check Schoology grades and class information.
