Honor Societies

Computer Science Honor Society

CSHS members take their computer science education further and become ambassadors of STEM/STEAM education within the school and community. CSHS is open to students who have been at Brunswick High School for at least one semester. Students should have completed at least one computer science class at BHS or CTC and earned a 3.0 (B) or higher. Lastly, students should have (and maintain) a 3.25 weighted overall grade point average and be recommended by three teachers.

National English Honor Society

- The Brunswick High School National English Honor Society (NEHS) is open to juniors and seniors who maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 and an English GPA of 3.5 or higher (an application must be completed). An annual induction ceremony will honor students who have excelled in the area of English/Language Arts and are committed to the national motto "duty goes with honor." Immediate benefits of affiliation include academic recognition, scholarship and award eligibility, and opportunities for networking with others who share enthusiasm for, and accomplishment in, the language arts. Students will meet monthly and have the opportunity to participate in literary themed extra curricular activities.

National Honor Society

- The National Honor Society elevates a school's commitment to the values of scholarship, service, leadership, and character. Students who are members of the NHS are engaged in their community service and school activities. Membership is limited to Juniors and Seniors who have a 3.5 weighted GPA and meet other membership requirements. Students who are eligible for membership will be invited to apply during the fall semester of each year.

National Art Honor Society
