The Conductors...

CHORUS

Paul Heinemann is known for his tremendous gift of connecting with middle school adolescents and his energy and enthusiasm have inspired his students to achieve at high levels. His choirs have consistently earned superior ratings at county, state and interstate festivals and competitions and they have performed as a demonstration chorus for multiple MMEA conferences. A graduate of Eleanor Roosevelt High School in Greenbelt, Maryland, he earned his bachelor's degree in music education from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Paul is in his 25th year of teaching middle school choir and is currently the choral director at Loiederman Middle School, the Performing Arts Magnet program in Montgomery County, Maryland. Paul has been invited to serve as a guest clinician and adjudicator for festivals throughout Maryland, as well as a guest conductor for numerous middle school honors choruses, including nine years as the resident director of the Montgomery County Middle School Honors Chorus. He has also been a presenter at local and state conferences multiple times. Additionally, Paul has served as an artistic and music director for theatre programs at both the middle and high school levels and is the Director of the JR (middle school) program for Young Artists of America. Paul was recognized with the Montgomery County Gazette's 'Favorite Teacher' award in 2011. His choral program was awarded the 'Program of Excellence' award from the Maryland Music Educators Association in 2012. Paul was most recently recognized with the 2018 Maryland Music Educators Association 'Outstanding Music Educator' Award.

ORCHESTRA

Wesley Thompson received her bachelor's degree in Double Bass performance with Music Education certification at the Peabody Conservatory of the Johns Hopkins University and her Master's Degree in Music Education at the Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Ms. Thompson is the orchestra director at Clarksville Elementary School in Howard County, conducts the Baltimore Symphony Youth String Orchestra, and maintains a substantial private double bass studio in the Baltimore area. Before joining the BSYO, Ms. Thompson conducted the Harford String Orchestra. In addition to teaching full time during the school year, Ms. Thompson is also the Executive Director of Bass Works, an internationally renowned intensive summer program for bassists aged 5 and beyond. A lifetime member and Executive Board member of the International Society of Bassists, she organizes the young bassist division of the ISB's biannual conference and currently serves as the organization's secretary. Ms. Thompson frequently acts as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator across the state of Maryland. She has acted as an orchestra assessment judge in Baltimore, Calvert, Fredrick, Cecil, and Howard Counties, and has also served as the guest conductor for the Anne Arundel, Carroll, Calvert, and Cecil All County orchestras. Ms. Thompson has also served as a solo and ensemble adjudicator in Howard County at the elementary, middle, and high school levels. Outside of the music world, Ms. Thompson loves to pursue her three favorite hobbies - yoga, baking for her friends and family, and spending time with her rescue dog Banjo."

BAND

<u>Carolyn Robblee</u> is in her tenth year as the Director of Bands at Belmont Ridge Middle School in Loudoun County, Virginia. During her time at Belmont Ridge, the Band program enrollment has more than doubled and has helped support the opening of a band program at the neighboring new high school. Ms. Robblee is a member of NAfME, VMEA, Women Band Directors International and International Clarinet Association. Ms. Robblee is an active clinician and adjudicator for students of all ages, student teacher mentor, and a performer. Previous to this position, Ms. Robblee taught in a variety of settings and age groups: elementary music, middle school band, high school band, as well as music education and studio clarinet at the university level. She has lived and taught in Minnesota, Oregon, Washington, Illinois and Virginia. Ms. Robblee holds a Bachelor's degree in music education from St. Olaf College, Master's degree in clarinet performance from Washington State University, plus additional graduate work in clarinet performance from Portland State University. During her summers she spends time teaching at various band camps throughout the area, participating in conducting symposia, as well as taking care of her beehives and gardens.
