CHORUS

Heidi M. Ackerman a Baltimore based musician, Heidi Ackerman is a sought-after conductor, clinician, and vocalist. With extensive experience conducting professional ensembles, she has retrained her focus on community choruses: diversifying ensembles through dynamic programming and invigorating membership by harnessing the joy of singing together. In her third season as Musical Director of The Frederick Chorale, she looks forward to collaborating with the Deer Creek Chorale on Drurfle's Requiem, sharing the podium with Equity Sings' founder Arreon Harely-Emerson and 2024's Armed Forces Day celebration with the United States Army Soldiers' Chorus. In the fall of 2022. Heidi was approached to establish and lead a community chorus for the Patterson Park Academy of Music in Baltimore, Maryland. Thanks in large part to Heidi's passion for choral music as well as her magnetic personality and fast paced rehearsal style, membership in the fledgling chorus has grown exponentially-with initial enrollment of 29, she's proud to have over 100 members this fall. She's honored to join the conducting staff with the Baltimore Choral Arts Society this season assisting maestro Anthony Blake Clark. A prior educator. Ms. Ackerman is in-demand as a choral clinician-this year conducting All-County choral festivals in Maryland and New York. Equally accomplished as a vocalist, The United States Army Field Band brought her to Washington D.C. from the west coast in 2013. As an enlisted conductor of the Soldiers' Chorus, she conducted concerts across the USA and Puerto Rico. As a soloist, she graced the stages of Carnegie Hall with the New York Pops, Severance Hall with the Cleveland Pops, The Kennedy Center with the National Symphony Orchestra, and The Henry Ford with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. Prior to joining the Army, Ms. Ackerman was a teacher and freelance musician in Arizona. She sang three seasons with Arizona Opera and soloed with the Phoenix Symphony on Mendelssohn's Elijah. She earned a Master of Music in Vocal Performance from Arizona State University and a Bachelor of Arts in Choral Conducting and Education from Northwestern College, IA. ORCHESTRA

James Woomert is the Director of Orchestras at Marriotts Ridge High School in Howard County, Maryland. Prior to arriving at Marriotts Ridge, James served as Director of Orchestras at Atholton High School in Columbia, Maryland, and Associate Director of Orchestras at the nationally recognized Carmel High School Orchestra Program in Carmel, Indiana. Originally from Toronto, Canada, James moved to Indiana to study at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, where he completed a Bachelor of Music in Viola Performance and a Master of Science in Music Education. While attending IU, James studied string pedagogy with Dr. Brenda Brenner and Mimi Zweig and was a member of the founding staff of the Fairview Violin Project, a pilot musical outreach program providing violin instruction to at-risk elementary school students. As well as conducting and coaching various southern Indiana youth wind and string ensembles, James also taught music introduction and methods courses at Indiana University as an Associate Instructor. In addition to his classroom and private studio teaching, James has been a freelance violist in the Indianapolis area, performed as a member of the Owensboro (KY) Symphony Orchestra from 2008-2012, toured with the National Youth Orchestra of Canada, and was selected to participate in three summer seasons with the National Academy Orchestra. James has also held leadership positions in the orchestras of Indiana University, performed with almost every regional orchestra in Indiana, and enjoyed the opportunity to work with such renowned musicians as Leonard Slatkin, Sir Andrew Davis, Jaime Laredo, and Joshua Bell. Orchestras under James' direction have recently had the honor of being selected as featured performing ensembles at the Maryland Music Educators Association State Conference, and the Midwest Clinic International Band and Orchestra Conference. James has served on the faculties of the Howard County Youth Orchestra, Baltimore Symphony Youth Orchestra, and the L.A. Philharmonic's National Take a Stand Festival. In 2018, James received the Outstanding Music Educator award from the Maryland Music Educators Association. James was a contributing author for Teaching Music Through Performance in Orchestra, Volume 4, which was published by GIA Publications in 2021.

Dr. Mark McCoy brings decades of music experience to the podium and relishes his time with each group he conducts. He has served as public school teacher, college professor, chair, dean, university president and now executive coach. He also served as Managing Partner of Princeton Entertainment Group and CEO of MusicFirst Festivals. His ensembles have garnered invitations to perform around the world including the Montreux Jazz Festival and Carnegie Hall. With degrees from Shepherd College, the Peabody Conservatory and Texas Tech University, Dr. McCoy has performed in Japan, Spain, Ireland, Italy, Switzerland, France, England, Germany, Austria and the Czech Republic as well as throughout the US including Carnegie Hall and the White House. Dr. McCov has composed musicals, operettas, operas, symphonies, and many instrumental works as well as a novel and a text on transformative leadership. Dr. McCoy was presented the "Teaching Excellence" award and inducted into Pi Kappa Lambda, Sigma Alpha lota (as "National Arts Associate"), Phi Kappa Phi and Phi Beta Mu, as well as Who's Who Among America's Teachers, Who's Who in Collegiate Faculty and the International Who's Who in Music and Musicians. A Hall is named in his honor at Shepherd University. He was a regular visitor and contributor for the National Association of Schools of Music and served on the National Commission on Accreditation.
