The Conductors...

CHORUS

Malcolm Washington has served as the Director of Choral Activities at Hammond High School for five years. Prior to teaching at Hammond, he was a general and choral music teacher at Elkridge Elementary School. Mr. Washington's love of vocal music began in the church, where he learned to sing Gospel Music. He later developed an affinity for classical singing through his school music programs in central New Jersey. - Mr. Washington earned his Bachelor of Music in Vocal Music Education from the University of Delaware, where he studied with Dr. Paul Head and Dr. Duane Cottrell. During his time at Delaware, he traveled the world, singing and conducting in France, Greece, Malta, Croatia, and a host of other countries. In addition to his teaching, Mr. Washington is a sought-after clinician, private teacher, and guest conductor.

ORCHESTRA

Dr. Hayden Denesha serves as the Associate Conductor of the Loudoun Symphony Orchestra and Music Director of the Loudoun Symphony Youth Orchestras. Dr. Hayden is also on faculty at Elizabethtown College in Pennsylvania where he directs the College Orchestra and teaches classes in Music Education. Dr. Hayden most recently served as Assistant Conductor for the Peabody Youth Orchestra and worked as an Assistant Conductor and Youth Orchestra Conductor for the South Carolina Philharmonic. - He recently worked on the U.S. premiere of Du Yun's *Where We Lost Our Shadows* at the Kennedy Center and served as an Assistant Conductor for a Baltimore city-wide production of Leonard Bernstein's *Mass* under the baton of Marin Alsop. He is also one of the few conductors in the world trained in original performance practice of accompanying silent films with live orchestra. In 2018, he was invited to Indiana University in partnership with the Jacobs School of Music to present the original orchestral score to *Phantom of the Opera* (1925) with renowned organ soloist Dennis James. - Dr. Hayden holds conducting degrees from the Peabody Institute at Johns Hopkins University, the University of South Carolina, and the State University of New York at Fredonia. He has also trained and performed at music festivals such as the National Orchestra Institute, Eastern Music Festival, Pierre Montoux School, and the PRISMA Festival in Western Canada. His principal teachers have included Marin Alsop, Joseph Young, Scott Weiss and David Rudge. He is equally at home as a performer on viola having earned his undergraduate degree in Viola Performance & Music Education. He has held viola section positions with the South Carolina Philharmonic, Aiken Symphony Orchestra, and the Carolina Ballet.

BAND

Dr. Lori Schwartz-Reichl is a champion of mentorship and motivation in education. Her unique educational experiences have permitted her to expand her multifaceted career into a portfolio as a clinician, conductor, instructor, writer, and speaker. She is the author of nearly 100 educational articles which have been reprinted with permission by more than 10 publications/organizations worldwide. She designed these mentoring pieces into a graduate course that she instructs at The University of the Arts (Philadelphia) and VanderCook College of Music (Chicago). Musically, Dr. Reichl has served as an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor for honor bands in a handful of states. Dr. Reichl is co-founder of Women Banding Together, a global group that cultivates mentoring relationships and fosters the development of women band directors. Dr. Reichl has served as a proud educator since 2001. She has successfully led secondary music programs in a rural school in Pennsylvania and two Title I schools in Maryland. In Pennsylvania she received the Superintendent's Award for Excellence in Teaching from the Daniel Boone Area School District and in Maryland she has been a finalist for both the Howard County Public School System's Teacher of the Year Award and the Howard County Parents for School Music Educator of the Year Award. - Dr. Reichl attended the Northeastern School District in York County, Pennsylvania. She received her Bachelor of Science in Music Education from West Chester University, Master of Music Education from Lebanon Valley College, Administrator I Certification through McDaniel College, and Doctor of Music Education from Liberty University. <https://MakingKeyChanges.com>
