# ***The Conductors...***

## **CHORUS**

**Dr. Rachel Cornacchio** currently serves as professor of music and director of the graduate program in music at Messiah University and is the conductor of the women's ensemble. - As a public-school educator, Ms. Cornacchio served as an elementary general music specialist in Peekskill, New York and director of choral activities at Newburgh Free Academy in Newburgh, New York. While in Newburgh, choirs and soloists under Dr. Cornacchio's direction received top honors at solo and ensemble festivals. - Dr. Cornacchio enjoys working in a diverse body of genres in choral music. Most recently she has worked with "modern day hymn writers," Keith and Kristyn Getty on both their Joy: An Irish Christmas and Hymns for the Christian Life tours, as well as Christian Gospel artist, Larnelle Harris. - Community organizations with which Dr. Cornacchio has worked include the Newburgh Symphonic Chorale and the Oregon Young Women's Choir as well as the Sing for the Moment Choir, a choir comprised of persons with Alzheimer's/Dementia and their care partners. In 2018, Dr. Cornacchio debuted a new choir, Threefold Cord Women's Choir. The choir, comprised of women from the east coast, seeks to mentor women of all ages through choral music. - Dr. Cornacchio holds a B.M. in Music Education from Nyack College, the M.M. in Choral Conducting and M.M.E. from Florida State University, and the Ph.D. in Music Education from the University of Oregon.

## **ORCHESTRA**

**Elizabeth Reinhardt** has been the orchestra director at Hammond High School in Howard County, Maryland, since 2009, where she conducts the chamber orchestra, concert orchestra, and symphony orchestra. She also runs the rapidly growing chamber music club that fosters independent student musicians and promotes public performances throughout the community. - Before becoming full-time at Hammond, Mrs. Reinhardt also taught at Patuxent Valley Middle School for eight years. While at PVMS, her group was invited to perform for the Maryland Music Educators Association conference, where students performed a concert for teachers from all over the state. - After working with the Howard County Elementary Gifted and Talented Sinfonia for many years, Mrs. Reinhardt currently serves as the co-director of the Howard County middle school gifted and talented orchestra. - Mrs. Reinhardt has judged solo and ensemble festivals, district orchestra festivals, and has worked with orchestras as a clinician. She has been a guest conductor for the UMBC Symphony Orchestra and has conducted numerous honor orchestras throughout Maryland. - Mrs. Reinhardt received her Bachelor's Degree from University of Maryland Baltimore County, where she was the winner of the concerto competition multiple times. She received her Master's Degree in Music Education from Peabody Conservatory and is also a National Board-Certified Teacher.

## **BAND**

**Dr. William Stowman** is in his twenty-sixth year of teaching at Messiah University. He is professor of trumpet, chair of the department of music, directs the trumpet ensemble, and directs the top jazz ensemble. - He is the recipient of the Robert and Marilyn Smith Award for Excellence in Teaching at Messiah College, and has also earned the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association Citation of Excellence for teaching at the collegiate level. - As a trumpeter, Bill has three solo CD's to his credit. *A Matter of Seconds*, *A Timeless Place*, and *Parable* have all met with positive critical acclaim. *Fanfare Magazine* wrote "crystalline clarity of tone, and impeccable legato" to describe his playing. He has also recorded with the North Texas Wind Symphony with Eugene Migliaro Corporon and the Keystone Wind Ensemble with Jack Stamp. - Bill regularly performs with Tromba Mundi Trumpet Ensemble, the Messiah University faculty brass and BrassCross. - He is active as a guest conductor, clinician, soloist, and composer. His works have been performed by the Atlantic Brass Band, Tromba Mundi, and various trumpet ensembles and wind bands across the country. - Bill holds the DMA in Trumpet Performance from The University of North Texas. He earned the MA and MMed from Eastern Kentucky University as a student of Kevin Eisensmith. His bachelor's degree in Music Education is from Indiana University of Pennsylvania where he studied with Dr. William Becker.
