

# Dual Enrollment Programs

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## What are the benefits of participating in Dual Enrollment?

- Opportunity to earn college credits while in high school.
- Reduces cost for students and families and decreases the time it takes to earn a college degree.
- Increases academic rigor in preparation for college and increasing chances of earning a degr especially for underrepresented students.
- Opportunity to enroll in a variety of course offerings.

#### How do I qualify?

Students must meet one of the measures to be college ready in each area.\*

#### Dual Enrollment: High School Based



- High school students taking FCC courses at high school during the regular school day
  - Mon & Wed or Tues & Thurs
- Must be college ready in English and/or Math
- Taught by high school teachers
- Course options <u>vary by school</u>
- All courses are eligible for dual credit
- Course registration is completed collaboratively by FCC and FCPS

High School Based courses are FREE for all FCPS students

Students do not pay for textbooks or materials

## Steps to Enroll

- 1. Meet with high school counselor
  - a. Receive FCPS Dual Enrollment paperwork
  - b. Determine need for placement testing
- 2. Apply to FCC www.frederick.edu/apply
- 3. Log in to FCC accounts



#### Dual Enrollment: Open Campus



- FREE tuition, fees, and books
- High school students taking college courses on FCC's campus or online
- Broad course offerings
- Only some courses are eligible for dual credit, students may submit a request for others
- Students are responsible for registering themselves for courses
- Homeschool and private school students receive tuition discount

Open Campus courses are FREE for all FCPS students

\*Students are responsible for transportation

#### Dual Enrollment: Open Campus



#### Steps to Enroll

- 1. Meet with high school counselor
  - a. Receive FCPS Dual Enrollment paperwork
  - b. Determine need for placement testing
  - c. Review Dual Credit opportunities
- 2. Apply to FCC <a href="https://www.frederick.edu/apply">www.frederick.edu/apply</a>
- 3. Meet with an FCC Academic Advisor (strongly recommended)
- 4. Register for courses online or through FCC Registrar's Office





#### Dual Enrollment: Career Pathways





- FREE TUITION, FEES and BOOKS for FCPS students there may be some textbook costs
- Career options and industry certifications or credentials at FCC in a variety of in-demand industries
- Courses taken inside high school, at FCC's main campus, or the FCC Monroe Center
- Program pathways will vary by high school
- Popular Programs (See full list of programs/courses)
  - Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)
  - Dental Assistant
  - Electrical
  - Welding





#### Dual Enrollment: Career Pathways



#### Steps to Enroll

- 1. Meet with high school counselor
  - a. Receive FCPS Dual Enrollment paperwork
  - b. Determine eligibility and need for placement testing
  - c. Review Dual Credit opportunities
- 2. Students create account & register for course programs:
  - a. For **non-credit courses**, students need to create a Continuing Education profile at <u>frederick.edu/quickenroll</u>. The school counselor will submit the paperwork needed to enroll.
  - b. For **credit bearing programs**, students need to apply to FCC: <u>www.frederick.edu/apply</u>
    Students will self-register for courses as they would through Open Campus.









- Graduates of Early College at FCC will earn an associate degree and high school diploma simultaneously
- Attend FCC full-time during their junior and senior years
- Apply as a sophomore by April 1, 2024:
  - Must be College Ready in both English and Math
  - 16 credits planned by end of sophomore year & 2.0 GPA
  - Application Packet submission: Counselor (1) and Teacher (2) recommendations
  - Early College interview



- Students receive FREE TUITION, FEES & BOOKS for all courses taken during Early College
- The Early College Coordinator will be an accessible academic advisor throughout the semester
- Students can return to their high school if unable to continue
- High school diploma is priority
- Most FCC majors are available
